2. LET S READ THE TEXT

Drommond C. (2018) claims that **makeup** and **skincare** are practices that have been with human beings for so long. One of the first cases took place in Ancient Egypt, where people daily spent many hours for **aesthetic** purposes. They liked using raw materials such as milk and seeds to improve their appearance or protect the skin from the intense heat. In this regard, Cleopatra was well-known for taking baths in donkey milk to preserve the vitality and beauty of her skin.

Defino J. in her blog How "Milky" Beauty Got So Big — & If It's Actually Good for The Skin said that according to the historian, the Greeks also used donkey milk in baths and face masks; sometimes mixing it with mashed berries or honey as "anti-aging and antioxidant treatments" that help in the skin regeneration. "Donkey milk was such a commodity that nobles would use the milk, and then sell it to lower classes for them to use, either for bathing, cooking, or making cheese". (para. 3)

According to Kazimierska K, Kalinowska-Lis U. (2021), scientists have discovered more benefits that come from the milk and its derivates in the use of dermatological treatments of chronic wounds, hastening **tissue** regeneration. Milk is also increasingly regarded as an active product that can improve the condition of the skin by reducing the number of acne lesions and **blackheads** (p. 1) Evidently, milk is much more than foodstuff and it can be a new gateway in the cosmetics industry that might revolutionize the way we see a cow. Hey hey hey!


- 1. This learning guide printed
